Workshop Aims	Aims This unit makes the often unacknowledged links to: the relationship between addictions and the long shadow of slavery, colonisations, and other forms of oppressions and domination; addiction as a universal human dilemma; the history of Addiction's theory and treatment; the birth of the 20 th century Recovery Movement; the inadequacy of the disease paradigm in addiction treatment; problems facing the field; and the Wellness Paradigm – a transpersonal spiritual model of healing work in addiction mediation.

Participant Learning Outcomes:	<p>On completion of this workshop participants should be able to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. identify and demonstrate the importance of cultural safety in working with groups in addiction's healing work. 2. define and explain addictions, and name three components which contribute to Indigenous peoples' substance or behaviour addiction. 3. describe and contextualise the inadequacy of the biomedical perspective for Indigenous peoples in approaching addictions. 4. identify and analyse the diverse aspects of addictions, the relationship between physical addictions and addictions to violence, power and greed, and understand what they are and what they do to people worldwide. 5. critically reflect on and evaluate the relationship between the spiritual void in contemporary lifestyles, addictive impulses and violent behaviours. 6. Explain three reasons why a module on addictions and spirituality will help to address the physical, mental, emotional, spiritual environmental factors needed to support recovery at the deepest level.
